Dear Valued Customer:

The California electorate approved a landmark environmental initiative on November 4, 1986 entitled the "Save Drinking Water and Toxics Enforcement Act of 1986" (commonly referred to as Proposition 65). The Act requires the Governor to publish a list of carcinogens and reproductive toxins. The law then states that "no person in the course of doing business shall knowingly and intentionally expose any individual to a chemical known to the State to cause cancer or reproductive toxicity without first giving clear and reasonable warning to such individual...".

FMC has evaluated our product, sodium sesquicarbonate, and based on this evaluation do not believe that exposure to it poses a significant risk of causing cancer or reproductive toxicity. Nonetheless, we are notifying you that the following listed chemical(s) are contained in our product at a detectable level. This will assist you in evaluating your products and any obligations you may have under the law. Our product shown below contains the indicated concentrations of chemicals listed by California as a chemical known to cause cancer (A) or reproductive toxicity (B).
